THE CREDIT UNION DIFFERENCE

Your credit union is a different kind of financial institution. We'll celebrate that difference this fall on International Credit Union Day, October 20, 2022. Check with your credit union to see how they're celebrating!

Here are some facts about the history of credit unions:

- The credit union idea started as a simple idea of people pooling their money and making loans to each other.
- The first true credit unions were created in the 1850s in Germany.
- The idea spread to communities around the world. In the early 1900s, a credit union started in Canada and the idea soon spread to the United States.
- International Credit Union Day has been celebrated on the third Thursday of October since 1948. The day is recognized to reflect upon the credit union movement's history, promote its achievements, recognize hard work and share member experiences.
- You are now one of the 375 million credit union members in 118 countries!
